PUBLIC QUESTION #1
SECURING OUR CHILDREN'S FUTURE BOND ACT

Do you approve the "Securing Our Children's Future Bond Act"? This bond act authorizes the State to issue bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$500 million. The money from the sale of the bonds would be used to provide grants to schools, school districts, county vocational school districts, and county colleges. Money from the grants would be used to build, equip, and expand facilities to increase career and technical education program capacity. Money would also be used for school security upgrades and school district water infrastructure improvement projects.

INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT

This act would allow the State to borrow a total principal amount of \$500 million. This money would be used to provide grants to county vocational school districts and county colleges to construct and equip buildings to increase capacity in career and technical education programs. The money would also be used to provide grants for school security projects at kindergarten through grade 12 schools. The money would also be used to provide grants for school district water infrastructure improvement projects. Three hundred fifty million dollars would support county vocational school district projects and school security projects. Fifty million dollars would support county college projects. One hundred million dollars would support school district water infrastructure improvement projects.

QUINTON TOWNSHIP BOARD OF EDUCATION QUESTION

Resolved, in addition to the regular advertised budget, the Quinton Township Board of Education will seek approval from the district's legal voters to raise an additional \$64,000 for two (2) buses to provide courtesy busing to students outside the Quinton "Village Area" and within two (2) miles. The Quinton "Village Area" encompasses Sickler Street, Smithfield Street, Robinson Street, New Street, Cottage Avenue, Lake Avenue, High Street, East Avenue, Waterworks Road from Quinton Alloway Road to the Lake, 41 Quinton Alloway Road to Route 49 and Route 49/Main Street from Bridge to 97 Quinton-Marlboro Road. Approval of these taxes will result in a permanent increase in the district's tax levy increasing the appropriation line number 11-000-270-511 contracted services between home and school-vendors.

INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT

Currently, the district does not transport students who attend Quinton Township School and reside within the 2 mile radius as per state guidelines, Title 6A:27-1.2. However, if the voters approve this public question, busing would be provided to the students who reside outside the Quinton "Village Area" and within two (2) miles. This would result in a permanent tax increase.

HOW TO CAST YOUR VOTES

STEP 1

Insert the Voter Card given to you by a poll worker into the yellow-framed slot on the front of the machine.

STEP 2

The first page of the official ballot will appear on the screen.

STEP 3

To vote for candidates on this ballot, press the circle to the right of your choices. A green checkmark will appear in the circle. (To change a selection, press the checkmark. The checkmark will disappear and a new choice can be made.)

To continue through the ballot, press the **NEXT** arrow in the lower right corner of the screen. The next page of the ballot will be displayed. To review previous pages, press the **BACK** arrow in the lower left corner of the screen.

To review all selections made, press the **REVIEW** button. All of your selections will be displayed. To make a change, press the desired item. The corresponding ballot page will be displayed. Make the necessary changes and press the **RETURN** button to continue.

To vote for a person whose name does NOT appear on this ballot, see **HOW TO CAST A WRITE-IN VOTE** INSTRUCTIONS.

After you have finished making and reviewing all of your choices, press the **DONE** arrow in the lower right corner of the screen on the final page of the ballot.

STEP 4

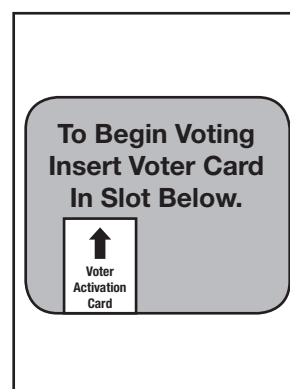

STEP 5

The voter card will pop out of the yellow framed slot in front of the machine and the **Thank You** Screen will appear. Remove the card and return it to the poll worker.

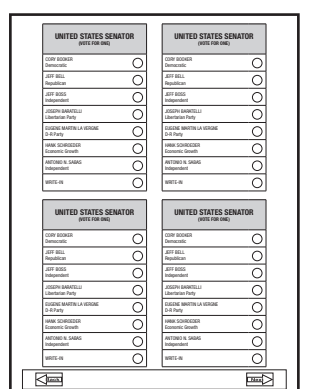
THE VOTING PROCESS

STEP 1



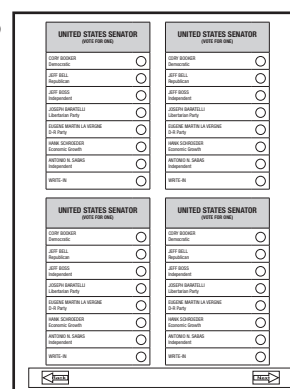
The voter inserts card into the **Yellow Slot** in the front of the machine.

STEP 2



The first page of voter's ballot will appear on screen.

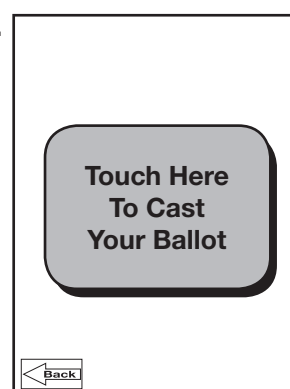
STEP 3



The voter makes a selection by pressing the circle to the right of his/her choice. A green checkmark will appear in the circle. (To change a selection, the voter presses the checkmark. The checkmark will disappear and a new choice can be made.) To continue through the ballot, press the **NEXT** arrow in the lower right corner of the screen.

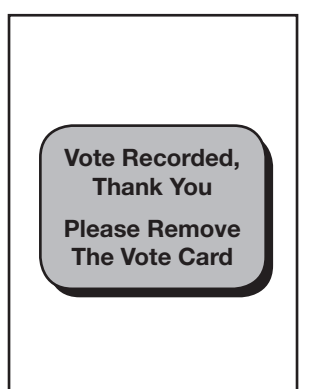
After the voter has finished making and reviewing all of the choices, the voter presses the "DONE" arrow in the lower right corner of the screen.

STEP 4



After pressing the "DONE" arrow the "CAST BALLOT" screen appears, the Voter presses "CAST BALLOT" to finish voting.
